Summary of Activities. Herbaculture Gardening Club Kit - The GREEN HAND GANG at Stratford St. Mary.

Started the after school Club and ran it from 20/3/15 to 17/7/15 with 14 pupils attending. It has become part of the Stratford St. Mary Primary School life. The New 2015/2016 year has started well with the after school club now running at lunchtime for Key Stage 1 and after school for Key Stage 2 on Fridays.

Kit purchased for the school gardening kits and has already been well used. Tools, materials, seeds, compost and plants.

Silver awarded the RHS School Garden design competition held at RHS Hyde Hall. Theme of Wonderland was represented by a swan's nest which is part of the AONB Wonderland. This was part of the publicity that was supplied to the AONB Newspaper with photos and content. Entered the Suffolk Show for 2016 garden design competition called "A Slice of Suffolk History".

Plans to Start 2016 Spring onwards with the GREEN HAND GANG. Growing rocket seeds that have been in space. Giant Pumpkin growing competition and exploring links to curriculum in the garden.

Still hoping to link with other schools in the AONB. Possible Summer term teacher training planned for local schools. Letters have been sent and publicity in the AONB magazine has promoted opportunities for local schools to join in the after school club scheme.

Flatford Fun day in May 2015 attended with screen printing a comfrey design onto material. Planning to be there for a herb walk activity in 2016.

MAIN BENEFITS:

Connecting Children to the place where they live. Making stories about specific trees/ plants in their area. Growing seeds and vegetable crops. Linking gardening & nature to the curriculum.

I would love to make the gardening more integrated into school.
